DIES DOMINI

The Lord's Day is the day of Christ's resurrection (see Matthew 28:1) and the day Christ's followers met to break the bread (see Acts 20:7). It is a day that is at the very heart of Christian life and is meant to be free of work. When we gather to celebrate the Eucharist – the sacrament of unity – we proclaim the resurrection of the Lord. As Pope John Paul II said in his apostolic letter Dies Domini, Sunday is the day of rest and joy “precisely because it is the Lord's Day, the day of the risen Lord.” Sports, dining, and recreation are all supplementary to Sunday's main purpose: celebrating the Eucharist. Praise and glory on this day!
