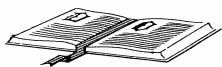

EASTER FEASTING

We come to this solemnity of Easter, hungry for the bread of life and thirsty for the living waters Christ promises. The disciplines of Lent – almsgiving, prayer, and fasting – have taught us how to hunger, how to face our emptiness, poverty, and powerlessness. Like Mary of Magdala, we approach the tomb, expecting a corpse, but instead find emptiness and mystery. The traditions of Easter season teach us how to recognize God’s presence among us, even in our loss, weakness, confusion, and isolation. Whenever we recognize that God is in our midst, our mourning is turned to joy. The experience of the Triduum suggests to us that it is not our outer circumstances that dictate our happiness, but our inner state. Christian joy springs from a deep spiritual knowledge and experience of love’s victory. There is no more death. Now there is truly nothing that can separate us from our God. True feasting is about discovering the miracle of God’s presence where we least expect to find him – within ourselves.

A Word from Fr. Jim

After a forty day journey of fasting and prayer, we have come to the glorious feast of Easter. Our English word for *Easter* derives from an old word meaning “to shine” or “dawn,” or the “the direction of the sunrise.” In the Easter season that we now enter into, the Church give us fifty days to let the light of Christ’s resurrection dawn in our hearts and minds until it burns brightly at Pentecost. What a wondrous feast this is. And like the early disciples who were scurrying here and there on the first Easter, we are not always sure how to respond to the good news of the Resurrection. Like the early disciples, it takes time to absorb just what the message of Easter is in our lives. We will hear many wondrous stories in the next fifty days. There was Paul who was the great persecutor of the early church who became the greatest preacher and missionary. We will hear from Acts that in some places the church spread like wildfire, and in other places it just seemed to wither and die as quickly as it started. Little by little the church grew. And so do we, as we keep this wondrous feast. All around us it is springtime now. And this beginning of new life is not just in the world of nature, but it is meant to touch every fabric of our being as well. The resurrection is now – today and not just a time in the past. Christ is risen, Alleluia. May you truly share in the fruits of this glorious resurrection this day.
