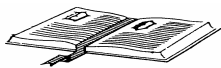

**DIVINE MERCY**

Divine Mercy Sunday is a relatively new solemnity inspired by an apparition to a Polish nun, Saint Faustina, who was canonized on April 30, 2000. She saw a vision of Jesus, his garments shining with rays of light. Sister Faustina received from him a prayer, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, which many Catholics pray during "the hour of mercy," between 3 and 4pm. It is difficult for humanity to fathom that the all-powerful God could love us when we cannot feel we merit that love. The revelation to Saint Faustina is one of the millions of ways in which God reassures us. Today we might ask ourselves what it will take for us to believe, truly and deeply believe, that the risen Christ is still active, still among us, still seeking our salvation. Spend time in prayer today reflecting on the many reasons you have to trust Jesus.

**A Word from Fr. Jim**

We had a glorious celebration of Easter here last week. We received 19 people into the church at the Easter Vigil, and the joy of that celebration flowed into Easter morning. The longer I live, the more I appreciate the wisdom of the church that allows us to bask in the glow of the mystery of this of our faith for a full fifty days. It takes more than a day, or even a week to absorb.

Today on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter, we conclude the Octave of Easter. Every day for the past week has literally been Easter. This Sunday has multiple focuses. Pope John Paul II established this as **Divine Mercy Sunday**. This day recognizes the abundant mercy of God offered to us through Christ. Pope John Paul recognized the Resurrection as a miracle of mercy which radically changed our human destiny. The U. S Bishop's Council also has given its support to this day as **Earth Day Sunday** and Pope Benedict is particularly concerned about climate change on the poor as he has said: "environmental pollution is making particularly unsustainable the lives of the poor in the world. In dialogue with the Christians of various confessions, we must pledge ourselves to take care of creation and to share its resources in solidarity." As we are the recipients of God's mercy, we pray that we can graciously extend it to one another, and in a very real way be a reflection of God's mercy to all of God's creation and especially to the poor and vulnerable. The two focuses of this day are deeply intertwined.

Sorry for the delayed response, we have been pretty busy here in the ER. Yes I did receive all 16 boxes. Thank you very much for all those wonderful cookies. Most of our wounded soldiers are unable to eat or drink right now due to their injuries but for the ones that could I made sure they picked out a few boxes for their trip to Germany and back home. The rest of the cookies, I went around the hospital and passed some out to the staff. They brought plenty of smiles to people's faces when I gave them a box or two. Some try to resist stating they are trying to lose weight, but almost no one can refuse Girl Scout cookies. I hope that is okay with you that I gave some to the staff as well. Some people have been here over a year and a little taste of home goes a long way. The packets of sweats and toiletries are great. I went and delivered them to the ICU and the ward. The wounded soldiers will definitely get good use out of them, especially with that long, sometimes cold trip to Germany. I went over to talk to the Charge Nurse and NCOIC of both sections and they were very pleased and thankful for the clothes. You may get an e-mail from them saying "Thank You". I still have a few boxes setting in my office because right now the ICU/ICW have nowhere else to store them. Besides the ward and ICU, I made sure the Physical Therapy clinic and patient administration areas received some as well. Those two places also give clothes to some of our wounded warriors. I just want to thank you and the lovely people at the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church for the cookies and care packages. They will go to good use. Without people like you all, life over here would be harder to bare. Thank You again and Happy Belated Easter. Yes, now I can start eating meat again. Thank you again. Rudy Palacios, MSgt. USAF
