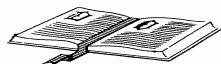

**A Word from Fr. Jim**

This is a very big week in the parish as we celebrated First Communion this weekend, with nearly 140 children receiving the Eucharist for the first time. And on Thursday, nearly 90 of our youth will be receiving the sacrament of Confirmation by Bishop Roger Gries, OSB, the auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Cleveland. Bishop Gries is the uncle of one of our confirmandi, and will be standing in for Bishop Campbell who is recovering from surgery. As we celebrate these sacraments of initiation, it might be helpful to recall the moment when Jesus gave us these beautiful sacraments. He gave us the Eucharist on the night before he died and He breathed upon the disciples His Holy Spirit as he was about to ascend to His Father. In other words, Jesus gave us these sacraments when He was about to be separated from us so that we could stay connected to Him. Without the Eucharist and the Holy Spirit, we cannot stay connected to Him and to one another, His community. It is that simple. And for that link to be vibrant, it is absolutely dependant upon the faith life of the parents. They are the number one influence on the faith life of their children. And so as we celebrate these great gifts that God has given to us this week, we pray that we may each of us nurture the gift of faith that God has given to us, so that these sacraments may truly fall on "good soil."
