**THE DOMESTIC CHURCH**

Now they would embrace their Christian identity, becoming a people for the world. 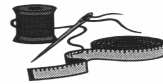

**A Word from Fr. Jim**

Today we mark a historical moment in the history of Seton Parish as we celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of ordination of our founding pastor, Msgr. Edward Fairchild. This is a great grace to both Msgr. Fairchild as well as to our parish. With priests being moved around as often as they do these days, it is rare now for a priest to have an association with a parish for over thirty years. Granted there were years of separation, but now we have this time of reconnection. When I was pastor of St. Thomas the Apostle, I presided over the funeral of Msgr. Harry Estadt who was pastor there for over forty years! The way Msgr. Fairchild is going with the blessing of his good health, he may well surpass Msgr. Estadt here at Seton Parish. For that we pray this day. Msgr. Fairchild built Seton Parish into one of the strong parishes of the East Deanery. From the very beginning that strength was the involvement of the parishioners in every aspect of its life and that continues to be its strength to this day. When Msgr. Fairchild was ordained in 1959, Vat. II had not yet even been thought of, cars had fins, and gas was 29 cents a gallon. In fifty years as a priest, Msgr. Fairchild has witnessed so many changes in the church as well as in the world. We are privileged to have not only his experience as a priest, but his longevity and history with our parish community as well. This is indeed a great grace for all of us. We pray that this day may filled with an abundance of blessings for Msgr. Fairchild for his lifetime of good and faithful service, and may God bless him with many more years of priestly ministry. We can never thank him enough for all that he has given to us.
