A Word from Fr. Jim

While the season of Easter concluded two weeks ago, the church provides us with two solemnities following Pentecost that keep the festive spirit of Easter very much alive in our church. Today we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood and Christ. Like all of our solemnities, this feast is an expression of our Catholic faith, and this feast conveys our belief in the real presence of the risen Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Without the Eucharist, we would not be a church. The Eucharist holds us together as God’s people and sustains as we journey through our lives. Throughout the year, at a number of times, we have feasts that focus on the on the Eucharist. On Holy Thursday, we celebrate the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. This summer, we will have an extensive teaching on the Eucharist as we read from John’s “Bread of Life,” discourse. We do this once every three years. And this feast that we celebrate once a year has the ancient tradition of carrying the Eucharist in a procession as well. The idea is that we are to bring Christ under the sign of bread onto the streets of our world, and we entrust our streets, our city and our homes to His daily care. As we celebrate this ancient feast this day, may our every day be filled with His presence, and may we bring His presence with our lives to a waiting world.
