You don’t know what an eSPN is or you haven’t been contacted. Maybe your neighborhood does not have a coordinator. Our parish is so large that we needed to find a way to keep in touch with all of our parishioners. We came up with the idea of segmenting our parish area into 22 eSPNs.
