A Word from Fr. Jim

With the 4th of July weekend, we enter into summer with all of its glory. It goes fast, so enjoy it. I will be on vacation for the next couple of weeks. I am not going to Argentina, or hiking the Appalachian Trail and our staff will always be able to get in touch with me. I'll be taking another cycling trip, this time in the San Juan Mountains in southwestern Colorado, and along the way I'll be spending time with friends and family. As always, I ask for your prayers that this cycling adventure will be a safe one.

For some time, the Sacred Heart statue in front of the church has been in a state of sad disrepair. The Knights of Columbus agreed to replace it and in fact ordered a replacement, and that company in South America went out of business and took the Knight's money with them. Meanwhile, the statue deteriorated even more. But a couple of our Knights have come to the rescue. Jerry Lowery and Dr. Bo Glavan have set about restoring this very old statue and it is looking very beautiful. At first they power washed it and repaired the fingers that were down to just exposed wires and have restored the damaged robe and cape. In a process that involves multiple steps, they have used concrete filler, adhesives, and fillers and then have meticulously sanded it all by hand.

You would think they studied under Michelangelo. Now they are involved in the end process of placing six coats of lime wash on it and the end result is the hope that it will have a marble like finish and resemble the old Roman statues the lined the old Roman cities. In the name of the parish, I cannot thank them enough for their efforts, and I hope they know from each of you, your appreciation as well.

eSPN...Elizabeth Seton Parish Neighborhoods: WHAT??

You don't know what an eSPN is or you haven't been contacted. Maybe your neighborhood does not have a coordinator. We are looking for people who are interested in meeting new people and who like the idea of a relational network in their neighborhood.
