A Word from Fr. Jim

While I was away on vacation, my dog, and the parish dog Ty became seriously sick and I had to have him put to sleep the day after I returned from vacation. Ty had Lymphoma. I think he came down with it in the spring, as I noticed then that he was starting to sleep a lot more and did not seem to have the energy that he once had. I thought he was just getting old. Then right before vacation, I noticed he was not eating as much. Shortly after I left, he literally "fell off the cliff," and I am lucky he survived until I got home.

He was my good buddy. His favorite time of the day came at the end of the day when he often came in to watch TV with me for an hour or two. If he knew I was over in my office working, I could see him waiting patiently in the front yard for me to leave, and when he saw me heading home, he would literally dance to the front door. He had long ago lost his penchant for chasing geese, but he was my "first alert" system for any and all things that were out of the ordinary on the parish grounds. He kept any and all critters away from the house, such as woodchucks, or squirrels from my bird feeders, and rabbits away from my garden. He loved to sit on the deck at night and wait for the rabbits to come out of the woods in the back, and then go for the chase. And he loved to pursue the deer. They could barely out run him. And he waited all day to chase the kids on bikes on Courtright. The neighbors over there thought he was a watch dog. Once or twice a few kids tried to climb the fence, and Ty took off in hot pursuit, and that was the last time they tried to climb to climb the fence. That was fine with me. Ty had this innate sense of what was right and wrong for the property. And many a parent in the parish brought their little child to Ty to pet because he was always so peaceful. We were blessed by God to have this beautiful creature who was so gentle and loving, and we will miss him greatly.
