A Word from Fr. Jim

As all of you know, God has given me a love and passion for cycling. It has kept me strong and healthy and has been the source of just so much joy, adventure, and friendship in my life. Now I have the opportunity to make an even greater contribution with this gift in my life. In three weeks there is going to be the biggest cycling event ever held in Columbus known as "The Pelotonia." It is going to be a fundraising cycling event from Columbus to Athens, Ohio the last weekend of August with the goal of raising millions of dollars for cancer research at the James Cancer hospital in Columbus. Even Lance Armstrong is committed to being a participant in it. Thanks to a generous gift from Netjets, every dollar donated will go directly to cancer research. There is never a time in my life as a priest that I am not ministering to someone who is suffering from cancer. I am always visiting someone at the James Cancer Hospital. This event combines my love of cycling with my ministry as a priest. But I cannot complete the ride without the support of the parish. To ride in this event, I must raise a minimum of \$1,500. I am looking for at least 150 members of the parish who would like to join my Peloton and make a contribution of \$10. That would be roughly \$.10 for every mile of the 100 miles I will ride on Sat. Aug. 29th. If you would like to be a part of the "breakaway" I will gladly accept any gifts of \$25 or more. But whatever you donate for this worthy cause is much appreciated.
