**A Word from Fr. Jim**

This is the week that everything got back into full swing here at Seton Parish.

Religious Education classes started, our Spy program is underway, Pre-School opened, and virtually all the committees are meeting as well. In two days time I had a Deanery Priest's meeting, a Deanery Pastoral Council Meeting, a Parish Pastoral Council Meeting and a Diocesan Presbyteral Council Meeting. Riding a bicycle 100 miles is easier than that many meetings. For the average person sitting in the pew, you might wonder what all these meetings accomplish. Well, for instance, in the Parish Pastoral Council meeting you get a good overview of just how much is going on and just how many people are involved in the parish. For instance, in one report from Social Concerns, we saw that it takes over 450 people to complete the various "missions" that they have undertaken. In liturgy, it takes over 150 people to make Sunday Mass happen here each weekend. And then we have all the teachers and aides who assist with the religious education and activities of our youth. It doesn't take much math to see that pretty soon we are up at well over 1,000 people that are engaged. And that is not even everyone. It was a real joy to see everything kicking into high gear once again this week. Seton Parish is an exciting place to be. In a few weeks we will be having our annual "Ministries Market Place," where we highlight all that is happening in the parish, and we encourage everyone to sign up to do at least one ministry if you are not already doing so. Start keeping your eyes and ears open to sense where God may be calling you to serve.
