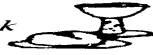

A Word from Fr. Jim

This week the Parish Finance Council met and we reviewed how we did the past fiscal year, and many of the projects that are underway in the parish. I will be getting a letter out to you shortly reviewing in detail how we did for past fiscal year. We are holding our own in these challenging economic times.

A very important piece of information that was discussed was that of a current opening of a staff position here at Seton Parish. Our current administrator and bookkeeper, Dave Riegelmayr will soon be stepping down and we are now currently seeking a replacement. This position would be part-time, 25-30 hours per week, with benefits. The person must possess a strong background in accounting and be conversant with current accounting software. In addition to working with the parish finances, this individual is involved in the management of the parish facilities, as well as the supervision of the employees, and supervises the maintenance.
