

**A Word from Fr. Jim**

On the weekend of Oct. 17 & 18 we will be offering the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the 5:00 and 9:30 Masses. The winter months that are ahead of us are often hard on people who must deal with chronic illness and thus are more vulnerable to serious illness. Elderly persons are good candidates for this sacrament, even though serious illness may not be present. At the same time I want to make it very clear that this is not the equivalent of a flu shot for everyone in the parish. The purpose of this sacrament is to receive the special grace to live with our infirmities and to experience healing both in body and soul. We do this in the setting of the Sunday Eucharist so that all who are present so that all who are present may experience the power of the healing prayer of the whole parish that is present. And those who are anointed witness to the parish their faith in the healing presence of God. Those who will be anointed will come forward following the homily.

Next weekend is our annual "Ministries Marketplace." This is a wonderful opportunity to get an overview of all that is going on in our parish. Even if you have been a member of Seton for a long time, as you go through the marketplace, you will find something new about the parish, and you will meet some new people. The key to the life of Seton Parish, and the life of our faith, is every member being a part of some aspect of the life of our parish. We have to do more than come to Mass on Sunday. Make the effort to walk through the marketplace, and then pay attention to how the Spirit may be nudging you to become further involved. Our marketplace is about Stewardship, one of pillars of our Vision Statement, and recognizing the need to give God our first fruits and not just the leftovers.
