We have had some beautiful days this week to enjoy the foliage of fall. As I have cycled around the county, not only have I enjoyed the leaves, but I also take delight in many of the fall displays that some people put out. In addition, I have come upon all kinds of images of the spirit world that you see hanging around and springing up from the earth. For ages now it has long been believed that ghosts and goblins have visited the earth around this time of the year. I've got some Irish in me, and we have this long held belief that these creatures can be a mischievous lot as well. So be kind to them in the week ahead. You might want to leave a few scraps of food out for them. In the old days, people would build a good fire in the hearth before going to bed to keep the "wee" folk warm. 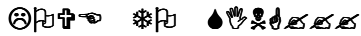


QUILTS OF LOVE...
