A Word from Fr. Jim

This week on Tuesday, we have the opportunity to exercise one of the most important freedoms in our land and that is the chance to vote. Be sure to take time out of your busy day to go out and vote. There are some very important issues that we have to make some decision about that day.

One of those decisions is Issue 3 concerning casino gambling in the State of Ohio. This matter has come up four times in the past several years and each time Ohio voters have said NO to casino gambling. It is the position of the Catholic Conference of Ohio and the Catholic Bishops of Ohio and my own to continue to be opposed to this issue. Very simply, this issue is not in the best moral, social, and economic interests of our state.

Quick money will be made by a few, but gambling is not the way to run a ship. More families will be seduced into financial hardship rather than helped. More societal problems will be aggravated, rather than improved. Issue 3 has been written by the gambling interests, toward the gambling interests. Would that you and I could write such deals for ourselves. This flawed casino proposal should not be written into our Ohio Constitution.

As we enter into the month of November, and the end of Daylight Savings Time, we find ourselves now preparing for the cold of winter. November also is the end of the liturgical year and today we celebrate the solemnity of All Saints, an ancient feast, dating all the way back to the early fourth century commemorating the early martyrs of the church. Today we remember all the holy men and women who have witnessed Christ in a whole hearted way. And as we pray today, we trust that they are preparing a place for us at the heavenly banquet. This is such a beautiful feast that unites earth and heaven – the communion of saints.

And tomorrow we celebrate the feast of “All Souls,” – and pray for those who may still be awaiting their heavenly reward. Tomorrow we are also celebrating our annual “Mass of Remembrance” at 7:00 p.m. for all who have been called to their heavenly home in this past year. We invite all the families and friends of the deceased in the past year to attend this Mass, and indeed, anyone in the parish who has lost a friend in the past year to attend. And so I am quite certain that includes everyone. This is a beautiful mass of consolation as we are once again reassured of the promises of our faith to us. The next two days usher in a whole month in which we remember the dead as the liturgical year ends and we begin to think about the end times.
