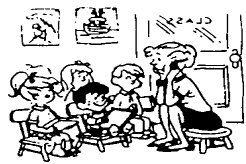

37th Annual March for Life

The Knights of Columbus is sponsoring a two-day, one-night bus trip to Washington, D.C. leaving Thursday, January 21st and returning in early Saturday morning hours of January 23rd.
