A Word from Fr. Jim

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has launched a national postcard campaign urging Congress to pass comprehensive immigration reform. The bishops acknowledge that the U. S. immigration system is broken and in need of repair. The postcard campaign urges support of immigration reform legislation that keeps immigrant families together, adopts smart and humane enforcement policies, and ensures that immigrants without legal status register with the government and begin a path toward citizenship. Our parish will begin participating in this campaign this weekend. Please stop by the tables in the gathering space and act on your faith and sign the postcards that will then be handed on to our senators and congressman. Thank you for your participation.

I would like to call your attention to a courageous young woman from our state who has undertaken an incredible journey to call attention to the plight of the millions of people who must live their lives without the essential element of fresh water. This young woman, Katie Spatz, from Cleveland, Ohio, left right after the first of the year from Dakar, Senegal and is rowing by herself without any support in a 19 foot boat across the Atlantic Ocean to raise money for those without water. With the marvels of technology and solar panels, you can follow this incredible journey on the web. Just Google – “Row for Water” to get to the site. And there you can view You Tube videos that give you all the background to this incredible journey, and follow her daily progress, see her photos, and read her blogs. I especially think our children will find this an absolutely fascinating adventure to follow and pray for her safekeeping. These are the kind of stories that lift all of our spirits on these long days of winter.

Thank you for your generosity for the recent second collection for the victims of the earthquake in Haiti. The collection is approaching \$10,000 as of this writing, and I am sure we will go well over that with all that is turned in this weekend. ENVELOPES FOR OUR

YOUTH: Teaching Children the Importance of Mass

Attendance: Let's be honest – all of us have times when we would rather sleep in on Sunday morning or keep doing what we are doing on Saturday afternoon rather than go to weekend Mass. Yet, participating in Mass is an extremely important part of our religious tradition. If you are going to teach a child to grow up to be a strong Catholic, you need to teach them the importance of going to Mass. It is while we are connecting with Christ through the Eucharist that our faith grows stronger and we can more clearly see the plans God has for us. If you are having difficulty convincing your children that Mass is important here are some thoughts or suggestions you can share with them.

*God asks us to give the first and best to Him. This includes giving the first hour of our week to Him through participation in the Sunday Mass. Is that too much to give to God who has given us everything?

*We don't necessarily go to Mass for our own personal enjoyment. We go to praise God and thank Him for all the good things He has given to us.

*The simple act of taking off your watch and leaving it on the dresser before going to Mass can be a symbolic gesture that the time in Mass is a gift of time that you are giving back to God.

The Eucharist is a banquet to which Jesus personally invites us. It was Christ's last gift to us before He died. How often should we refuse His invitation?

Beginning this month we will begin using envelopes for the youth in our Grades 1-6 Religious Education programs. You can refer to bulletin announcements that will get you ready to help explain to the youth why we are using the time, talent, and treasure envelopes.
