### ENVELOPES FOR OUR YOUTH:

**Teaching your children to be Generous:** How can you help your child counter the culture of consumerism in today’s world? Here are a few tips:

- 1) Remember that children will say what you say and do what you do, but they will not do what you say. If you want them to tone down their own list of wants, make a conscious effort too tone down your own list. Let them know that you are already satisfied with all that you have and you do not need more.
- 2) Involve your children in determining how your family will share its gifts this year. Often we send charitable gifts off to missions, hospitals and homeless shelters without our children ever being aware that these gifts are being given. Gather together the requests for gifts that come your way and then hold a family meeting to discuss where and how you wish to help. Let children help make the decisions about those who need your help.

Encourage your children to give from their own funds. If your children have any form of income, no matter how small – allowance, babysitting money, or gifts from relatives – help them determine a fair amount (usually 10% to share with others. Teach them that this “gift to the needy” is just as important as any gift they buy for friends or relatives through the year.
