ENVELOPES FOR OUR YOUTH:

Freedom and Materialism: As children grow older, they long for their own brand of freedom. They want to be free from family rules. They want to be free to do what they want. **And they want to be free to have what they want.** Parents must remind their children that any form of freedom comes with responsibility. God made us all to be free, yet the Bible is full of the expectations that He has for the way we are to live our lives. There are over 2,300 quotes in sacred scripture that tell us God expects us to share the many blessings He has given to us. For example, we are told in Sirach 4:31: *“Let not your hand be opened to receive and clenched when it is time to give.”* Our country may be free but all citizens have the responsibility to obey the laws. We are not free to steal or kill or cheat to get what we want. Likewise, when we let our children be free to go out with their friends, we still expect them to follow the rules we have taught them in life about safety and proper behavior. When talking to children about freedom it is important to remind them that they have the freedom to do right. They have the freedom to reject the materialism of our culture and embrace an attitude of gratitude and sharing instead.

In his writing on the family, *Familiaris Consortio*, our Holy Father has written, *“Children must grow up with a correct attitude of freedom with regard to material goods, by adopting a simple and austere lifestyle and being fully convinced that man is more precious for what he is than for what he has.”* In our materialistic society we do our children a big favor by teaching them that they have the freedom to say, “I don’t need that!”
