**A Word from Fr. Jim**

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday this week. This is the church's annual season of grace and renewal. It is important that each of us make a deliberate effort to keep a good Lent, and if we do, we will be rewarded with new life in the season of Easter. It will take some effort on our part. The hallmarks of Lent are very simple: prayer, fasting and the giving of alms. We do not do this alone – we do it as a church. There will be many opportunities to keep a good Lent in our parish this year. We will be having a Mission in a couple of weeks. The ever popular "black books:" are back that are great daily guide to prayer. And there are many other opportunities such as the Lenten Book Club that I offer, or our weekly scripture study, or our Lenten devotionals. You can't do it all. But plan now to keep a good Lent.

**The Precepts of Lent**

Everyone during Lent, 14 years of age and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, and all the Fridays of Lent. As a rule of thumb, most everyone I believe can abstain from meat on these days unless of course they have ill health. And everyone between the ages of 18 and 59 must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means that only one full meal is allowed, and the two other meals should not equal the full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but consuming liquids such as juices or milk is permitted. This does not include alcoholic beverages.

Finally, I still have room in the Lenten Book study that I will be leading. We will be reading a book on the Eucharist. We will meet on the Mondays of Lent either in the afternoon at 1 p.m. or at 7: p.m. in the evening – whatever works best for your schedule.

May we all have a blessed Lent.

## ENVELOPES FOR OUR YOUTH:

**Teaching Children to Be Good Stewards:** We have been working to help teach our children to be good Christian stewards. Research shows that the attitudes children form towards generosity and sharing are formed early in life and are influenced by the people closest to them. Here are some suggestions for how you can help your children form lifelong, positive attitudes about sharing the many gifts that God so generously gives.

Let your children know that you find joy in your own stewardship activities. Otherwise, they might perceive your volunteer activities as just one more of the many chores you must do.

Teach children that they are not what they own. Our commercial society wants us to think that we are identified by the things we have. Teach children that it is what they **are not** what they **have** that makes them special. Remember that when we die we leave behind all that we **have** and take with us all that we **are**.

Let children know that it is a privilege to work for God. Encourage them in any of their volunteer efforts. Teach children that things don't bring us happiness. This is true because whenever we get the thing that we think will make us happy there is always one more thing that we think we must have next. The way to be truly happy is not by having good things but rather by doing good things – things like being kind, helping someone else, sharing time with friends and family, etc.
