**A Word from Fr. Jim**

Today is known as *Laetare Sunday*, a day that marks the halfway point of Lent, and celebrates our joy at being that much closer to the Resurrection of Christ. The name of the day comes from the old entrance Antiphon from Mass, "Rejoice, Jerusalem." And the gospel picks up on this theme of rejoicing with the beautiful and well known story of the prodigal son who returns home to the warm embrace of his loving father. The elder son, however, is filled with resentment at the father's lavish forgiveness of his brother, and he remains in the field. We are not told whether the father's message of extravagant love would move him into the celebration. As we continue on our own Lenten pilgrimage this day, this parable is meant for us all and invites us to a fuller life. Will we respond to the invitation?

You would have to be deaf not to be aware that there is a lot of conversation going in a lot of communities, and indeed on the state level in regards to the banning of texting while driving, and even the use of hand held phones while driving. Many states are way ahead of us on this matter already. The evidence is overwhelming on how the use of these devices distract one while driving. I see it firsthand on our own parking lot with people talking on their cell phones and completely oblivious to pedestrians who are right in front of them. I would ask that we make our parking lot a "No Phone Zone." It's just a matter of time before another pedestrian is hit. Let's all take the, the "No Phone Pledge," and make the Seton parking lot a safer place for us all. Thank You.

**THE PRODIGAL SON**

The story of the Prodigal Son helps us refocus on the meaning of Lent. This is a time to change our ways, to turn back to God our Father, and to appreciate and share the gifts we have received. As we begin the second half of our journey with Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl, we remember that we are called to be stewards of what god has given us, and we connect our prayers and fasting with our giving.
