A Word from Fr. Jim

With the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we are moving closer and closer to Holy Week, which begins just one week from today! While the season of Lent is slipping away fast, there is still time for us to make the changes that we need to make in our lives during this holy season. We can begin to see the wondrous changes that are underway almost daily now in the world of nature around us. In the gospel that we hear today, there stands a woman accused of adultery. She is about to be stoned to death. But she also stands under the loving gaze of God's mercy in the eyes of Jesus. Perhaps during these days of Lent, we might become more aware of our own selfishness, indifference to certain people, or lack of generosity. Let yourself experience Jesus' loving gaze. There is still time. Shall we make the changes we know we need to make in our life patterns? We do not know if the woman left and turned her life around. What will we do? The transformation in the natural world is about to happen in our spiritual lives as well.
