A Word from Fr. Jim

Today we begin our solemn entrance into Holy Week. It is a week in which we try to set as much aside as we can to enter as fully as we can into all the celebrations of the days ahead. As Paul said to the Romans: *If only we suffer with him so that we may be also glorified with him.* The three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday or Easter Sunday comprise one liturgy. Set aside the time now to participate in these days that form the heart of our faith. All of our preparations of Lent have to celebrate these days. They are filled with great grace and a noble simplicity. If there was ever a time to make the effort to come to church, these are days and this is the time. Please note elsewhere in this bulletin, the special times for all of our Easter services.

Palm Sunday - The Passion

This week we walk with Jesus through his passion, death, and resurrection. We begin to experience the sacrifice he made for us and how we are also called to give our life for others. Catholic Relief Services' Operation rice Bowl has helped us walk with our sisters and brothers who daily take up the cross of poverty. Through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we unite ourselves in the one human family that is God's creation.
