A Word from Fr. Jim

The celebration of the Resurrection breaks into our lives this day filling us with a hope and joy that is unparalleled to any other news that we will ever receive. And this Resurrection is not simply something that is about a future event, but it shapes and indeed transforms the present moment unlike any other occurrence that has ever happened in human history as well. For that reason, we are so caught up in it, and so taken by it.

We are not just passive observers of a story long ago. No, there is something very present about the Resurrection. That is why we are filled with so much joy. That is why our hearts sing out with Alleluias. That is why Easter is more than a day and every day is Easter for the next seven days in what is called the Easter Octave. And Easter is a whole season that lasts 50 days that culminates with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us in the feast of Pentecost. In this holy season we will celebrate the Easter sacraments of many Baptisms, Confirmations, and First Holy Communion with our fellow parishioners. Yes this truly is a wondrous day and season of the year. May God bless you and your family with a most joyous and happy Easter.
