A Word from Fr. Jim

Everyday for the last several weeks, we have been reading in the newspapers, and seeing broadcasts both on the internet and our televisions about the matter of the sexual abuse scandal and the Catholic Church. I will say flat out, that there is nothing that has undermined the work of our church more than the sexual abuse of our youth by our priests. And we know now that this is a scandal that has a long history in our church. Today, thankfully, the church I believe is addressing this matter in a strong manner that does all that it can so that everyone in our schools, programs and services are in safe environments at all times. Sadly, what we know now, we did not know thirty, forty, and fifty years ago. Believe it our not, it was not uncommon for priest abusers to have their therapists recommend that they could return safely to ministry after treatment! And bishops sadly acted on this misinformation. We know now that is not possible. There is no doubt in my mind that Pope Benedict wishes to do all in his power to remove this plague from our church. Read his recent statement to the Irish Church. There are many who are seizing this crisis as an opportunity to attack Pope Benedict and our church in the most vicious of ways and so undermine the incredible good work that the church does all throughout the world. Let us not loose sight of this. And let us pray for our Holy Father and our Church that as we weather this current storm, we reflect the love of Christ in an even greater way.
