**A Word from Fr. Jim**

Seton Parish is a bustling place and there is often so much that is going on that it is very difficult to keep up with it. This means that there are a tremendous number of people that are involved on so many levels in our parish. Our parish is a hub and the “Good News” flows out of from it in a multitude of ways. Each of us plays an important part in the mission of our parish. One of the main consultative bodies that provides leadership and direction to our parish and to your pastor is the Pastoral Council. They are the “eyes and ears” of the parishioners who always try to see the bigger picture and keep us going in the right direction. In my nearly seven years as your pastor, we have had a stellar Pastoral Council that truly attends to the good of the whole parish. Our Pastoral Council is made up of both representatives of commissions such as the finance council, youth, and liturgy, as well as “at large representatives.” In the past year, such items as our Pictorial Directory and New Parishioner Welcomes flow out of the working of the Council. We keep a close eye on the ongoing development of the Parish Vision. The work of the Council never ends. Next week we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, and this is an appropriate time to consider if the Spirit is calling you to serve your parish in this capacity. We now have a couple of “at large” openings for the coming year. The Bishop’s Annual Appeal continues this weekend. We have reached a total of approximately \$77,000 toward our goal of \$162,387. We are not quite half way there with approximately 14% of our parishioners participating. This tells me that we can easily reach our goal. Now we need the rest of the 85% to do their part! Every penny over and above the goal that is reached comes back directly to the parish. I ask you to do the math. Clearly you can see that if everyone does their part as the first 14%, this could be a tremendous boost for Seton Parish as well as for the Diocese. We all benefit. Without this annual appeal, the ministry of the larger church of the Diocese of Columbus could not take place.
