A Word from Fr. Jim

This week we celebrate the wonderful feast of Pentecost and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. Without the Holy Spirit, the Church would never have made it past the first century and could not have reached beyond the borders of the small frail country of Israel where Christianity was born. And so when we think about the challenges that the Church faces today, they are nothing compared to what they were when it began. Nevertheless, we are every bit as dependent upon the Holy Spirit today as we were when the Church began to carry on its mission. And so, we must always keep in mind that the mission of the Church is not in my hands, but the future of the Church will always be guided by the Spirit who is with it at all times. Today we are reminded that the Holy Spirit will be with us at each moment in our history and will guide and teach us in all ways. And each of us has the Spirit poured out upon us as we are entrusted with a portion of God's mission. May we assume the portion that God gives us. I know that there is a great deal of love for our Catholic Church amongst our members and that fills me with a great deal of encouragement as I endeavor to carry out the mission that God has given to me. May each of us be open to the Spirit that is poured out afresh upon us this day.

We are continuing with our 2010 Bishop's Annual Appeal. We have reached a total of approximately \$96,000 toward our goal of \$162,387. We are now over half way there with approximately 18% of our parishioners participating. Have you responded yet to this appeal? We need everyone's participation to reach our goal. Every penny over and above the goal that is reached comes back directly to the parish. Clearly you can see that if everyone does their part as the first 18%, this could be a tremendous boost for Seton Parish as well as for the Diocese. We all benefit. It was the special vocation of these monks and their large dogs (St. Bernard's) to rescue travelers lost in the mountains. Parents, please take time to discuss with your students the ideas/themes discussed on the envelopes. How has your child learned about giving of his or her time and talent or maybe treasure to help the "other" among us? Do you take time to pray as a family? Do you share dinner at least once a week?
