A Word from Fr. Jim

Congratulations to all of our graduates whom we are honoring at the 9:30 Mass this morning. As they move forward with their lives, may they stand secure with the strength that has been given to them over the years from their family and faith. May our graduates realize how abundantly blessed that they are, and through our example, may they continue to prepare themselves to share abundantly the gifts that God has given them.

There will be many joyful celebrations this weekend with the families and friends of our graduates. Parents, please keep a watchful eye on your celebrations, and the celebrations that your children will be a part of, lest the use and abuse of alcohol turn a wonderful moment tragic.

Today is the beautiful feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This has been a universal feast in the church for eight hundred years. There was a time when many of the faithful did not receive the Eucharist on a regular basis, and the focus of the feast became exclusively adoring the presence of Christ under the Eucharistic species of the Bread. Elaborate processions became a part of the feast. After the 2nd Vatican Council, the name of the feast was changed to the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The change is significant. For the emphasis of the feast is not only on devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, but also on our celebration of the Eucharist. Today is a good time for us to reflect upon our participation in the Eucharist. Am I attentive to the Word of God when it is proclaimed? Do I pray the Eucharistic prayer? Do I fully proclaim my responses at Mass? Do I reverently receive the Eucharist? Do I do my part to make the church conducive to prayer? We all have to work at this. This is a beautiful feast to begin.

We are starting to wind down our 2010 Bishop's Annual Appeal and we still have a ways to go. We have reached a total of approximately \$112,000 toward our goal of \$162,387. We are now at 70% of our goal with approximately 22% of our parishioners participating. Again we are falling short. But it is not too late. With your gift, we can make our goal. For those who have not, I encourage you to match the gift of your fellow parishioners. Again, I am asking everyone to consider making a pledge of at least \$150 toward this appeal. Thank you for doing your part.
