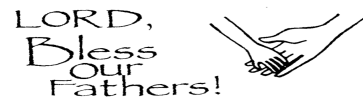

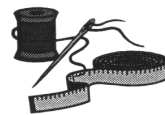
NEIGHBORHOOD CORNER

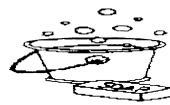

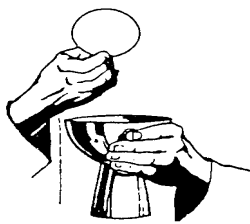
