A Word from Fr. Jim

It is hard to believe that we are already at the 4th of the July weekend. We all cherish these holiday weekends for the little breaks they give us and the time they allow us to gather with family and friends. Obviously this is an important day in the history of our country as well. King George III wrote in his diary for this day, "Nothing of importance happened today." The king of England perhaps yawned as this day came to a close not knowing what had occurred in faraway Philadelphia. And it is interesting to note as that the very signers of the Declaration of Independence did not make their names public until Jan. 19, 1777. Historians suggest that Congress may have feared that if the revolution were to fail, the signers would have died as traitors. 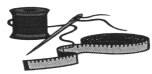

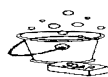
