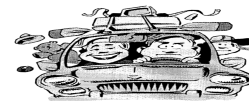

**From Deacon Hector:**

*On behalf of my wife, Mary-Lloyd, and our entire family, I thank you for your prayers, personal condolences, and notes of sympathy and comfort in the loss of Mary-Lloyd's Mother, Kathleen Lievense. Kathleen lived a long and full life. She lived a life full of love, adventure, and travel. I still remember the first time I assisted at Mass as a Permanent Deacon and gave my first homily. I knew I was ok when she gave the high sign. Kathleen was a task master and she knew good preaching when she heard it (Grin!). That was a wonderful memory that I will cherish for a long time to come. When we first moved here, we did not expect to stay any longer than 4 or 5 years, but the Lord had other ideas. Mary-Lloyd's father, Lloyd Lievense, died in Pennsylvania in 1997 and we decided to buy his cremains in our Parish's cemetery in Old Town, Maine. However, since becoming a Deacon, three of our four children have moved to the Columbus area, and Mary-Lloyd and I have decided that this is our permanent home. Upon the death of Kathleen, we decided to disinter Mary-Lloyd's father and buy his cremains along with Kathleen's in our family section of Holy Cross Cemetery. Our home is here is Central Ohio.
