**A Word from Fr. Jim**

If you have driven on the property at all during the week, you probably have noticed that there has been a lot of work being done on all of our buildings over the past month. I would like to review with you today all of these projects.

First of all, we have had a lot of roofing work done. The entire education wing, the portico and the rectory have all received new roofs. These roofs all had significant storm damage due to both hail damage, and the hurricane about two years ago. Insurance paid for all but \$1,000 of the \$70,000 in roofing work that we have completed.

In addition, new gutters were placed around the entire education wing, and we now have gutters around the portico, so that you will not be drenched when you walk under the portico when it is raining. The old gutters were inadequately sized for the building, and the whole new gutter system was included in the insurance claim as well.

I am sure that you have noticed that we have had some concrete repair work done as well on walkways in random places where it was crumbling and where we had some serious tripping hazards like near the Mother Seton Shrine.

When you drove into today, I am sure that it was obvious that the parking lot has had the major cracks filled and has been resealed.

There has also been some stucco repair work done both on the church near the Blessed Sacrament Chapel as well as out at the Parish Activity Center where there has been some serious water damage that is being attended to. In addition, the back side of my rectory had some cracking as well where the building was added onto several years ago that is being repaired.

On the interior of our buildings, we have had some carpet repair done to address some tripping hazards. In addition, all of the classrooms in the education wing have been repainted, and Herrmann Hall will be repainted as well in the next week or so.

In a facility as large as ours, there is no end to the projects. But we keep working at them one by one. It's a big job and it is never finished. This is a part of being good stewards. We will use some of the profits of our festival to meet some of these expenses.

### WHAT IS RCIA – Is it for You?

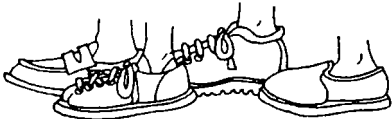
